Leaf Pick Up & Composting of Yard Waste

The DPW will be picking up leaves on Mondays and Thursdays from October 9th to November 13th.

Pick up will generally take place before noon. Please rake leaves to the edge of the pavement. Leaf piles MUST be free of sticks and branches as these will plug the leaf vacuum. Piles with sticks and branches will not be picked up.

If you wish to bag your leaves or sticks for DPW pickup, you must use bio-degradable bags. These paper compost bags are available at the DPW garage and are free of charge to Village residents. Properly bagged compost items may be left at the street sides for DPW pickup. If you take the bags to the compost area yourself, please reuse the bags if possible.

Reminder: Plastic bags are NOT allowed in the compost area.

Consumer's Energy for their Tree Grant Program, which continues to fund the planting of trees in the Village. This allows for the replacement of trees that are mature and dying.


The Consumer's Energy Tree Grant requires that the trees are non-invasive trees and planted in the Village right-of-way.


